Update from the clerk on the replacement pump house door that was being considered. It is high quality door that should last several years. The last door has been in place for 25 yrs. Report from the clerk on the cost from Ameren to put an additional street light on West Elm and Church St. The Village would be responsible for the extension to the nearest pole which would be \$747.50. (\$6.50 a foot for 115'. It was decided not to pursue that at this time. Motion was made by Kevin Horath and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chad Smith.

It was reported that new findings on the pond request on Pine Street. Landowner will have to apply for a permit with Army Core of engineers and get approval before moving forward. This is due to possibility contamination of water.

## New Business

Clerk reported that Medicom are in the process of applying for a grant to bring fiber to the Village of Iola.

The 2022 road maintenance program was reviewed and approved. Plans are to try to do some oil and chip this year. Motion to approve was made by Kevin Horath and Victor Mitchell 2nd.

There was discussion regarding whether a property owner should have to pay for sewer taps that are not being used but are on their property. Clerk will report at next meeting on the number of customers this would apply to.
